



How Can I Become a Leader who Influences Culture for Christ?

“I know it’s time to do something. I haven’t figured it all out yet about God, but I do know that regardless of my weaknesses, God wants me to be a voice of truth to those around me. Most people wouldn’t call me a born leader, but I know that I have something to say. I’m not really sure how to get people to listen to me. A godly leader is someone who is not demanding or coercive, but rather has the skill of getting people to willingly work with him or her because of their personal influence. James Hunter, author of *The Servant* says, “Authority cannot be bought and sold, given and taken away. Authority is about who you are as a person, your character, and the influence you’ve built with people.” There are many kinds of leaders, but a godly, effective leader must be humble, a good listener and a learner who is not afraid to ask questions and seek wise counsel. Above all, each person of influence must personally commit to excellence and to the goal that God has set before him.

So, what does this look like in your world, today? It starts with learning the Truth and living out a Christian worldview, while encouraging others to do the same. It continues when we speak boldly about the truth that God has told us about in His Word, no matter what the costs. What is God calling you to do? Begin a Bible study, stand up for Christ in class or at the workplace, take notice of people’s needs and meet them with Christ-like affection?
