

Was Jesus Christ Resurrected? Why Does It Matter?

"Do I believe in God? Totally! Do I believe that Jesus was this amazing teacher who spoke truth, love and compassion? Absolutely! But does it matter if I think He conquered death? Isn't just following His teachings enough? Won't being good and following Jesus get me into heaven? Conquer death? I don't understand why it matters if He was raised from the dead."

In 1 Corinthians 15:13-14 Paul says, "If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith." There is no other option for Christians; Jesus died and rose again. Just look at what Paul says, "If Christ wasn't raised from the dead our faith is useless."

Jesus was more than a good man. He was the Son of God. Our Holy and all-powerful God came down to earth, and because he longed to restore us and bring us back to fellowship with Himself, He paid the debt for our sins through His own death. Think about it.

Man is sinful; every single human ever to live (except Jesus) sins. Everyone! (Romans 3:23).

In that moment of death, the enormous severity of man's sin, not only killed Jesus, but for a moment separated Him from God the Father and the Holy Spirit. But then, three days later, He conquered death; He rose from the grave! He was alive, forever! He had conquered death. It was done. The price was paid once and for all. It gave hope and assurance to those who believed that when they died, they, too, would live forever in Heaven with Jesus!

The problem with just believing in the life of Jesus and leaving out the death and resurrection is this: the whole purpose of Jesus coming to earth was to pay the price of our sin, so that we could live abundant, full lives while here on earth and in Heaven. Knowing and believing this, which is verified by a multitude of historical writings, gives us continued assurance of God's love for all people all the time!
